

Dear Friends,

This Sunday, June 6, is Confirmation Sunday. Let us pray this week for Lea Wheeler, Jillian Forth and Abigail Phillips who will be confirmed and let's all tune in to support them on Sunday. They have prepared beautiful art and poetry which speak to their growing faith.

We are beginning a new transition in our worship life together. We're taking it step by step with our main priorities being the safety and well-being of the congregation and maintaining the momentum we have built with our Zoom worship.

We have done very well on Zoom with average worship attendance around 50 throughout the pandemic. We will continue to offer Zoom worship through the summer.

On July 11 we will have an outdoor worship service at 9:00 a.m. and then continue with our regular Zoom service at 10:30 a.m. We're not sure yet about August but if it goes well on July 11 we may plan an outdoor worship for August as well.

This month is John Wesley's birthday, a time to reflect on his thoughts on the Methodist community.

"Nothing can be more simple, nothing more rational than the Methodist discipline: it is entirely founded on common sense, particularly applying the general rules of Scripture. Any person determined to save his soul may be united (this is the only condition required) with them. But this desire must be evidenced by three marks: avoiding all known sin, doing good after his power, and attending all the ordinances of God."

This is a community in which all who join do so voluntarily. No one has ever been forced to come to this vineyard. But if they do come they must earnestly commit to these three commitments: avoid sin, do good according to the grace given, and use the means of grace God provides in prayer, Scripture reading, and church attendance.

In Wesley's societies, those who joined were "placed in a class" once a week and reviewed quarterly. Wesley wrote, "If nothing is objected to him he is admitted into the Society" and continues as long as he "walks according to his Profession. If not, "either the offense or the offender [is] removed in time." Those who refused or neglected correction were not continued in the societies. Every quarter each member of the society would be reviewed and given a validation (sometimes called a "ticket") that entitled them to remain in the fellowship. Morning prayer was observed at 5:00 a.m. The Lord's Supper was provided on Sunday. Wesley explained, "On Sunday evening the Society meets, but care is taken to dismiss them early, that all the heads of families may have time to instruct their several households."

The Methodist Societies were an evangelical revival movement within the Church of England. At that time they were harassed by mobs, rioters and hooligans until civil order was restored. Wesley writes that "God stirred up the heart of our late gracious Sovereign," George II, to order that the persecution be quelled. In response to the appeal by the elder William Pitt, the king declared in open court: "I tell you, while I sit on the throne, no man shall be persecuted for conscience' sake." From that time forward, the Methodists were largely "permitted to worship God according to their own conscience."

THE HISTORY CORNER

Did you know that the oldest Methodist congregation in America is just down the Hudson River at 44 John Street in the Manhattan financial district? It is the John Street Methodist Church also known as Old John Street Methodist Episcopal Church. The present church was built in 1841. The congregation was founded on October 12, 1760 as the Wesleyan Society in America.

The Society's first church was built on this site in 1768. It was a blue stucco barn and it was called the Wesley Chapel. The second church on the site was finished in 1818 and was thought to be too extravagant by the pastor and some members of the congregation who left the congregation. The present church was built when the widening of John Street occurred.

In 1769 John Wesley gave a clock to the church that is now in the church museum. Hymnist Fanny Crosby was a long-time member of the church.
