We had our charge conference on Saturday, November 20 together with the other churches of the Villages Cooperative Parish.

PRESENT: Members of the Cooperative Villages of Westchester (which included pastors and some church members).

Present from our church, Asbury United Methodist Church of Croton, were Pastor Doug Cunningham, Tina Pershing, Jud Ramaker, Don Daubney, Sheila Furjanic, Becky Asedillo and Bette Wood.

Our district superintendent Rev. Simone E. Law and Rev. Jason Radmacher opened the meeting with greetings and prayer.

The members of different churches shared the ministries their churches have been involved in during the past year. Some of those were: feeding the homeless in Peekskill, providing lunches for the Salvation Army in Peekskill, the *Run Against Hunger*, the refugee project to welcome Afghan refugees, a Halloween sale, Zoom services, hybrid services, active Bible studies, Christmas tree sales, gift cards for Christmas gifts, flood recovery help, Sunday school on Zoom, daily call to prayer, baby shower for children at Bedford Hills Correctional Facility (which included new clothing for children and their mothers), collection of soap for women at Bedford Hills Penitentiary, Bible study for young adults, Zoom Sunday school, a food drive, members going to ECAP to buy groceries for clients, decorating wreaths for a wreath sale, choir presentations, help to women leaving prison, and a class on world affairs which is offered to the community.

Several churches mentioned how important services on Zoom had become. Pastors could make services available to their congregants and at the same time increase church membership. Some churches have opted to hold face to face services, but attendance is fairly low.

THE HISTORY CORNER

The National Christmas Tree lights will be turned on by President Biden on December 2 continuing a tradition began by President Calvin Coolidge in 1923. Coolidge had become president that summer after the death of President Harding, and under Harding the idea of a national tree was being discussed by his Secretaries of Agriculture and Forestry. The custom of having a Christmas tree in your home had been increasing and the danger to the national forests where people were cutting down trees was becoming a problem. The Department of Agriculture was promoting farm grown trees to farmers as an additional source of income and a way to preserve the forests. Coolidge was from Vermont and had fond memories of Christmas trees in his home that were cut from forests in Vermont. So, he agreed to the idea of a national Christmas tree and the first one was from Vermont. The lighting of the tree has been a ritual ever since that first lighting except during times of war or national emergencies when the symbolic tree remained dark or was lighted only briefly. The tradition of erecting a community tree spread across the country and tree farms have flourished, including here in New York State.
