In-Person Hybrid Worship

We are making great progress toward the launching of hybrid worship at Asbury. The Trustees' team of Marc Caterino, Jud Ramaker, Stephen Goe and Larrie Sutliff have put in many hours of expert labor in building a beautiful production booth, running wires and installing cameras and monitors. Our vision is that when we do get back to in-person worship, we'll be able to bring our Zoom congregation along in a hybrid worship that includes both in-person and on-line participation.

After we finish the construction and installation next week, the next step will be extensive testing of the audio and video equipment. We are grateful to Mike Grayeb, an expert in this field, for his help throughout this project. He will also be helping us with training our production team. Dorene Picker is leading the organizing and training of our teams. We are looking for two trained people to operate the equipment each week. We hope to develop five teams of two to cover each Sunday of the month including a fifth week in some months. So if you or someone you know would like to be trained in this cutting edge technology and participate in this new ministry, please contact her or the church office.

If all goes well, we hope to begin in-person hybrid worship the first or second Sunday in May. We give thanks for all those who are working hard to bring this vision into reality. We look forward to the day when we can worship in the sanctuary together with longtime Asbury members worshiping in town, upstate, and in cities and states across the country and even across the Atlantic.

Jodi Hanlon has retired as Director of the Asbury Play and Learn. We are grateful for her 32 years of great service to this important ministry of our church. Hundreds of Croton children have come through the school and many are still connected with our church. THE HISTORY CORNER

In the early 1880's in some areas of Germany Easter eggs substituted for birth certificates, extending the tradition of the egg as a symbol of awakening and birth. An egg was dyed and then a design was etched into the shell with a needle or other tool. The design included the recipient's name and birth date. These eggs were honored in law courts as evidence of identity and age.

INTRODUCING OUR NEW PASTOR

REVEREND BETTE JOHNSON SOHM

The Staff Parish Relations Committee had the pleasure of meeting our new pastor, Reverend Bette Johnson Sohm at a recent meeting. Though we are all sorry that Pastor Doug announced his retirement and will be leaving at the end of June, we will be happy to welcome Rev. Sohm to Asbury on July 1. She will be serving three-quarter time at Asbury and one-quarter time at Mount Kisco Methodist Church. We are also happy that Reverend Sohm will be living in our parsonage in Croton.

Reverend Sohm has always had a strong call to lay leadership. After serving on numerous committees while a congregant at Faith United Methodist Church in Staten Island she began taking lay speaker courses and expanded her learning by taking two-year courses and earning certificates in areas that included spiritual direction, Gestalt Pastoral Care, and emerging worship.

Rev. Sohm recognized and answered a call to ordained ministry in 2005 and went on to serve part-time as a local pastor with Pine Plains UMC in Pine Plains, New York (2005-2008) and Good Shepherd UMC in Astoria, Queens (2008-2010). In 2010, Rev. Sohm earned a Master of Divinity (M. Div.) from Drew Theological Seminary. She moved to New Paltz where she was commissioned as provisional elder and ordained in 2013.

Rev. Sohm was appointed to St. Paul's UMC in Northport, New York in 2018 and is currently serving as pastor of Bethel United Methodist Church in Staten Island. She is active and engaged on various levels within the Conference. She has led retreats for various churches and helped establish and lead the Staten Island branch of the District's Lay Speaking Ministries School.

In her "spare" time, Rev. Sohm enjoys reading, movies, jig saw puzzles and history. Rev. Sohm holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in theater. She met her husband, Glenn, when he was the technical director of the theater at Richmond College on Staten Island.
